As a Professional Dietitian working directly in diabetes care with the Diabetes Management Centre in Halifax, Nova Scotia, Cynthia provides both group and individual diabetes education working closely with the diabetes team members delivering insulin starts, pump starts and education to those newly diagnosed along with routine follow ups. Throughout Cynthia's career her committee participation extends far beyond her participation with Committees such as, Diabetes Canada Professional Section Executive, Professional Development, Best Practices Committee, and Advocacy Committee.

Attending Diabetes Canada Conferences, in person, and now virtually, provides Cynthia with the knowledge of return to her community and present up-to-date information to her colleagues and professional community. In addition to providing support to Medical Residents and Dietetic Interns Cynthia recognizes diabetes education must happen outside of the professional medical setting.
